 - Demonstrates level-appropriate skills in the target language
 - Any other information you'd like to share about it!

You will be assessed based on your Presentation, the level-appropriate skills in the target language, and the quality of your project: engaging, comprehensive, and demonstrate cultural literacy

General Procedures

1. Speak with a [relevant faculty member](#) in the Department of World Languages & Cultures to plan your project and to discuss [which micro-credential\(s\) fit\(s\) your needs](#).
2. If necessary, (like for the Interprofessional Cultural Citizenship Micro-Credential), speak with a faculty member from another department to approve your project.
3. Work on your project! Let the faculty know if anything changes. Use the appropriate checklist below to verify you're meeting the requirements.

5. Wait (patiently) as faculty assess your project.
